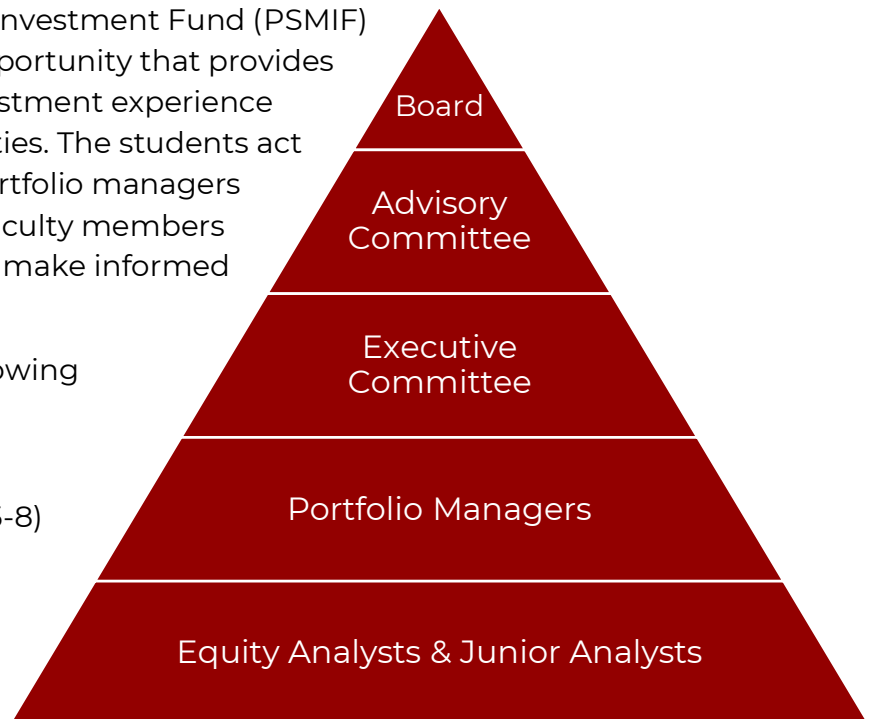
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Fund Overview

The Price Student Managed Investment Fund (PSMIF) is an experiential learning opportunity that provides students with real world investment experience managing a portfolio of equities. The students act as the equity analysts and portfolio managers and receive guidance from faculty members and industry professionals to make informed investment decisions.

Position Overview

The Chief Operating Officer (COO) of the PSMIF is an integral role that will determine the success of the initiative.

Opportunity

In this position, a person will:

- Work with experienced faculty members and finance professionals.
- Have various networking opportunities.
- Gain leadership skills.
- Earn 3 credit hours.

Requirements

To be eligible for the position, a person must:

- Be a current Bachelor of Commerce student in the Asper School of Business.
- Register for courses as a full time or part time student during the Winter 2025, Fall 2025 and Winter 2026 semesters.
- Enroll and successfully complete FIN 4230 in the Winter 2025 semester.
- Have a minimum of 60 credit hours completed at the time of application.
- Have a minimum GPA of 3.50.
- Have completed the following courses with a minimum grade of B+:
 - FIN 2010 – Introduction to Finance
 - One additional finance course

Responsibilities

COO responsibilities include, but are not limited to:

- Working alongside the Executive Committee to ensure the execution of the strategic vision and success of the Price SMIF.
- Conducting the recruitment and interview process for all Portfolio Manager and Equity Analyst positions with the Executive Committee and Faculty Advisor.
- Help create partnership opportunities for the fund to connect with investment professionals to enhance learning and exposure for fund members.
